The team will play Westminster Saturday morning and play a team of Georgia collegiate players Saturday afternoon, beginning at about 3 p.m. Sunday at 10 a.m. the team will face an “Old, Bold, and Grey” team from various Atlanta clubs. Westminster High School Varsity Takes Fourth at Mercersburg Invitational:

For the 3rd time in 3 years, and the first time as an official “varsity” team, Atlanta’s Westminster High School traveled to pastoral Mercersburg, PA, to compete in an Invitational Interscholastic Team Tournament against host school Mercersburg, Baltimore’s Shadyside Academy and Gilman School, and Washington’s Potomac School

For the 3rd & final time, senior & captain Sawyer Duncan anchored the ‘Cats at #1 racquet. Sophomores Sheldon Taylor, Alex Hoffman, Mac Stormant, and Will Redd, played 2nd, 4th, 7th, and 9th racquets, respectively. Juniors Cooper Veysey, Jay Lively, Robbie Ostrowski, and Constantin Overlach, rounded out the squad at 3rd, 5th, 6th, and 8th racquets, all coached by Tom Rumpler.

Final results: Westminster lost to Potomac, 0-9; Westminster defeated Shadyside, 7-2; Westminster lost to Mercersburg, 2-7, Westminster lost to Gilman, 4-5.

Highlights included:

- Cooper Veysey’s astonishing 4-game win over Mercersburg’s #3 player, a player who played #1 just last season.
- Sheldon Taylor’s routine 3-game win over a very accomplished Gilman player.
